“Citizens App” will allow users to submit service requests via smartphone and web”

Holland, Michigan – Holland City Council will introduce the new “Citizens App” smartphone and web application at the City Council meeting on Wednesday, September 19, 2012, 7:00 p.m. Developed by CitySourced, the “Citizens App” connects residents-to-government via smart technologies.

Mayor Kurt Dykstra said, “The “Citizens App” will empower and engage residents to report problems in their neighborhoods via an easy-to-use app on their smartphones. In return the City can address the areas of concern quickly, save time and money, and improve services.”

The application uses GPS technology to automatically provide the problem’s location,

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simplifying the reporting process for users while increasing the reliability of report location for the service crews. The application is available free of charge via iTunes, GooglePlay, Blackberry and Windows Phone.
