Red Cross Plans Mobile Distribution Route for Ottawa County

As the flood water begins to recede in West Michigan, the Ottawa County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Management shifts its efforts toward recovery. To assist, the American Red Cross is distributing clean-up kits. Kits include mops, scrub brushes, shovels, and cleaning chemicals along with other items to help people once they are able to return to their homes.
