## Attention: Flag Warning System

There are dangerous currents at this beach,  
and fatalities have occurred.




**Red = Stop.**

**Stay on the beach  
and out of the water.**



**Yellow = Caution.**

**Watch for dangerous  
currents and high waves.**



**Green = Go.**

**But stay aware of  
changing conditions.**

- A **red** flag means that there is a high risk of drowning.
- Swimmers: Stay away from piers and other structures.
- Even an Olympic swimmer couldn't win a race with a dangerous current.
- Absence of flags does not assure safe waters.
