DESCRIPTION The two story clapboard cross gable Eastlake house was built on a stone and cement block foundation. The vertical and horizontal decorative stickwork emphasizes the house's structure. All the gables are sheathed with fishscale shingles and are further enhanced with a sunburst motif. The entry porch displays a modern lattice balustrade.

DESCRIPTION This one-and-one-half story bungalow is built on a cement block foundation. The shingled side-gables and the dominant roof gable display typical Art-and-Crafts features with exposed rafter ends and knee braces. Almost a full-width shed roof front porch shelters the central entry flanked by multilight sidelights. Square porch posts rest on cement block piers.
