Holland Energy Fund Launches Residential Program

Holland, MI – The [Holland Energy Fund](#) launched a new residential energy-efficiency education program, Home Energy 101.

Home Energy 101 is free and open to all City of Holland residents, whether they own or rent. The program offers residents a one-time session with a trained, non-profit Energy Adviser. The Adviser will conduct a walk-through of the resident's home, giving them tips and recommendations for home energy savings. In addition, all participants will receive up to \$300 in free energy-saving measures. The goal of the program is threefold for residents:

- Reduce their carbon footprint
- Save money
- Make their home more comfortable

City Manager Keith Van Beek stated, "When residents participate in the Home Energy 101 program, they become a part of Holland's Community Energy Plan in creating a more sustainable community for today and future generations."
